

FESTUS HIRES NEW GIRLS BASKETBALL COACH



The Festus R-VI School District has hired Jake Hogan to lead the Varsity Girls Basketball program. The Board of Education unanimously approved Hogan's hiring during the executive session of its regularly scheduled meeting on Thursday, May 18.

"We are excited to bring Jake on board as our varsity coach," said incoming Festus Athletic Director Jason Therrell. "He brings great energy and enthusiasm and we are happy to have him as a Festus Tiger."

Before coming to Festus, Hogan, 29, coached basketball, football and baseball at Bishop DuBourg (4 years, 1 year as head football coach), Lutheran South (2 years), St. Dominic (3 years), and football and basketball at Westminster Christian Academy for one year. Hogan is also a baseball coach for the St. Louis Recruits organization.

Hogan says he's proud to be coming to Festus to serve as the new Girls Basketball Head Coach. "Our program is going to have some fire to it, and it's going to be fun to watch. With what we have returning and what we will build, Festus Girls Basketball is going to compete with integrity, class, and discipline!"

Hogan will also be an assistant football coach for the Tigers.
